Rheolau / Rules

- a) All exhibits in Farm Produce and Vegetables Sections must be grown by the exhibitor.
- b) Entries in all classes must be in by 10.15 a.m. and collected after 4.30 p.m. on the day of the Show.
- c) Judging will commence at 10.30 a.m. prompt in all sections of Farm Produce, Vegetables, Fruit, Flowers and Floral Art.
- d) Entries accepted in the Farm Produce Vegetables, Fruit and Flowers Section on the morning of the show, up till 10 a.m., EXCEPT FLORAL ART when the closing date for FLORAL ART is 31st July, 2019.
- e) The Judges' decision is final and they are empowered to withhold prizes when exhibits are considered unworthy.
- f) In the event of a tie in the Farm Produce, Vegetables, Fruit, Flowers and Floral Art Sections, the winner will be decided by the number of first prizes gained in the above section.
- g) Certificates of merit will be awarded to the best exhibit in the Farm Produce, Vegetables, Fruit, Flowers and Floral Art Sections.
- h) Only officials will be allowed in to the Horticultural and Flower Sections during judging.
- i) The Society will not in any case, or under any circumstances hold itself responsible for any loss, damage, misdelivery, illness or accident, that may occur through or to any exhibit, trade stand or person from any cause whatsoever, and it shall hold the Society harmless and indemnify it against any legal proceedings arising from any of the above named circumstances.
- j) The tent will close to the public at 5.00 p.m.
- k) Presentation of trophies will take place in the Horticultural Tent at 4.00 p.m. prompt. Prize money will be paid in the tent between 4.15 p.m. and 4.45 p.m. on production of the prize-winning cards.
- l) The marquee will be open on Tuesday night from 4.00 p.m. to 9.00 p.m. for competitors who wish to stage their exhibits.

N.B.—There is NO ENTRY FEE charged for any exhibits. Each exhibitor WILL BE CHARGED THE RELEVANT ENTRANCE FEE at the Main Gate. Horticulture/Floral Art competitors staging exhibits on Tuesday night to pay their entrance fee to the Steward on duty.

The Society can at any time go to an exhibitor's garden.

NOTE TO EXHIBITORS

- (a) Competitors may provide their own backing as there are light grey backdrops.
- (b) Depth of staging throughout 61cm.
- (c) **All exhibits must be arranged in the marquee except Class 185.**
- (d) An exhibit is plant material with or without accessories.
- (e) Judging will be in accordance with National Association of Flower Arrangement Societies rules (see note below ↕)
- (f) The marquee will be opened to the competitors from 6.30 a.m. Judging to commence at 10.30 a.m. prompt and collected after 4.45 p.m. on the day of the Show.
- (g) In the event of a tie, the prize money will go to the exhibitor with the most first prizes.
- (h) All exhibits to be the property of the exhibitors.
- (i) For accurate measuring, a metal measuring tape must be used.
- (j) The marquee will be open on Tuesday night from 4.00 p.m. to 9.00 p.m. for competitors who wish to stage their exhibits. **Relevant entrance fee to be paid to Secretary.**
- (k) The committee will not take any responsibility for loss or damage to the competitors' exhibits.
- (l) **Novice Class:** This class is open only to competitors who have not previously won a 1st prize in classes 184-189. A novice may win three 1st prizes in this class before ceasing to enter as a novice.

Statement for Show Schedules

An exhibit is composed of natural plant material, with or without accessories, contained within a space as specified in a show schedule.

NAFAS Rules state that disqualification will take place for the following reasons:

- ★ Failure to comply with any specific requirements of a class as stated in a show schedule, e.g. the measurements or the components.
- ★ Inclusion of fresh material that does not have roots or the cut ends of stems in water or water-retaining material.

Exceptions: Air plants, cactii, fruits, grass turf, lichen, moss, succulents, vegetables and long-lasting plant material (including strong fibrous stems) WHICH WILL REMAIN TURGID FOR THE DURATION OF THE SHOW.

(Definition of 'turgid' : the state of firmness of plant tissue resulting from adequate moisture, causing the plant cells to be fully expanded).

- ★ Inclusion of artificial plant material (unless specifically allowed by a show schedule).

An exhibit is composed of natural plant material with or without accessories. Natural plant material is any vegetable matter. It includes fresh, dried, garden, wild or made up plant material flowers, foliage, fruit, vegetables and seaweed. All may be additionally coloured.

A Perpetual Cup [No. 54] is given in memory of Gill Hobby; also £15 will be given by Mrs Celia Evans to the competitor with the highest number of points in the Floral Art Show.

Certificate of Merit for the best exhibit in the Floral Art Section.

The Pam McGrath Memorial Perpetual Salver is given by Cardigan Flower Arranging Club for the best exhibit in The Novice Section Class 190.
