HORSE SECTION RULES & REGULATIONS

NPS Mountain and Moorland

Affiliation Number: S29.016

These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. Ponies must be registered in the main body of their respective Mountain & Moorland Stud Books. Part breds are not eligible. Qualifying rounds for most NPS competitions are open to ponies owned by NPS members and non-members but only ponies owned by adult NPS Qualifying or Life members are eligible to qualify for the final of the competition at the NPS Summer Championship Show at the Three Counties Showground, Malvern in August 2026.

The highest placed pony owned by an NPS member in each class will qualify for the final. Where this pony has already qualified, the pony standing next in line which is owned by an NPS member, and has not already qualified, receives the qualification. Qualification may go to no lower than 3rd place. Judges and /or stewards are requested to check membership cards prior to presenting the qualifying rosettes.

NPS/WTJ Insurance Brokers Ltd Home Produced Ridden Championship — Riders of Home Produced ponies (see definition in the NPS Rule Book) can wear a white arm band in classes where this is indicated. These ponies, if owned by NPS members, are then eligible to qualify for the final at the NPS Summer Championship Show. Cups will be presented to Prize Winners

Traditional Gypsy Cob Association

Affiliation No: 25/0208/STQ

No known breeding required to enter these classes.

No Membership required to Enter these Classes.

TGCA Breed classes are qualifiers for the Best of Breed Finals at the Traditional Gypsy Cob Association's (TGCA) National Breed Championship Show "TOYS".

Traditional Classes are open to all traditional gypsy cobs and are qualifiers for the Traditional Finals at 'TOYS'.

Stallions – All stallions (four years and over) in order to enter any TGCA affiliated class **MUST** be TGCA registered, have passed TGCA stallion evaluations and their TGCA stallion disc displayed on their bridle. Stallions and colts over the age of two, **MUST** be shown in a stallion bridle with a metal bit and chain lead as per the current TGCA rulebook.

Current TGCA members must present their Membership card and Qualification card to the judge in the ring for signature.

Non-members MUST receive a qualification card from the judge and have 21 days to join the TGCA and register their horse to validate the qualification. Please refer to www.tgca.co.uk for further details including membership, horse registration and showing rules (contained within the members handbook).

The Greatest Gelding Award

The award is aimed to encourage the showing of geldings, therefore creating a market for often unwanted colt foals and enabling the creation of a network of potential performance prospects to represent the best Traditional Gypsy Cob breed in the World at the highest level.

This Award should be given to the highest placed registered Traditional Gelding.

Quest for a Star Championship Inc Youngstock Quest for a Star- Traditional Gypsy Cobs

1st, 2nd and 3rd from the TGCA classes above may go forward to the Quest for a Star Championship as per below rule.

ONLY current TGCA members and horse/pony that is already TGCA registered can exhibit in this championship, if exhibit already has their Quest for a Star Qualification in particular section, they should be ask stand aside to allow members that have not yet qualified.

Membership card and Member's qualification card (specific to that exhibit) **must** be presented upon **entry into the ring**. The Champion and Reserve qualify for the Ultimate Star Championships at TOYS.

The Greatest Gelding Award - Traditional Gypsy Cobs

The award is aimed to encourage the showing of geldings, therefore creating a market for often unwanted colt foals and enabling the creation of a network of potential performance prospects to represent the best Traditional Gypsy Cob breed in the World at the highest level.

This Award should be given to the highest placed registered Traditional Gelding. The judge will award this within the classes/championship.

Shetland Ponies

- Classes must be confined to SPS-BS registered ponies. Ponies must be named on the entry form and in the catalogue if one is produced. Society rosettes must only be given to ponies registered with the Society or to foals eligible for registration.
- 2. Three-year-old fillies with foals at foot may not be shown. All foals must be a minimum of three weeks old on the day of the Show.
- 3. IN ORDER TO ENTER A STALLION CLASS AT AN AFFILIATED SHOW, ENTIRE MALES AGED 4 YEARS OLD AND OVER MUST HAVE AN "S" NUMBER AND HAVE BEEN SUCCESSFULLY THROUGH EITHER THE SPS-BS STALLION ASSESSMENT PRIOR TO 2006 OR THE CURRENT SPSBS VOLUNTARY VETERINARY EXAMINATION. Ridden stallions MUST display a stallion bridle badge. In-hand entire males 2 years and over are advised to display a stallion bridle badge.
- 4. There must be no colts or entire males in Young Handlers classes. Children under 14 years old may not show colts (excluding foals) or entire males in In-hand classes. Children under 12 years old on the day of the show may not show entire males in ridden classes. In the interests of safety, hard hats must be worn by all handlers aged 14 years or under in Inhand classes. Exhibitors should not kneel but remain standing while in the ring. Hard hats must be worn by all exhibitors, irrespective of age, in ridden classes. Ridden and driven ponies must be 4 years old or over.

In ridden Classes, if a rider falls off at any time whilst in the ring, both pony and rider must leave the ring, rider dismounted, and take no further part.

CHAPS

This Show is affiliated to The Coloured Horse & Pony Society (UK). Affiliation No. 25-061

Both owner and the rider/exhibitor need NOT be a member of CHAPS (UK) nor must the horse or pony be registered with CHAPS (UK) to compete. However in order to qualify both owner and rider/exhibitor need to be a current showing member and have a valid qualifier card. Members should

apply to CHAPS (UK) for appropriate qualifier card. The CHAPS (UK) Championship Show will be held on 14th – 16th August 2025.

The following classes are CHAPS (UK) Qualifiers 154 - 157.

For full rulings and information on competition/qualification, please refer to the CHAPS (UK) Members' Handbook; or visit www.chapsuk.com. Only Skewbalds/Piebalds may compete in these classes. (as defined in the current CHAPS UK Members' Handbook) may compete in these classes. All stallions, 4 yrs old and over entering these classes must be graded with CHAPS (UK). All stallions must wear Stallion ID discs in the ring without exception.

IRISH DRAUGHT HORSE SOCIETY (GB)

This show is affiliated to the IDHS(GB) and therefore horses competing in Classes 206 - 212 should be eligible under the below criteria:-

- All Pure Bred Breeding and Youngstock In-hand exhibits must be the progeny of a Graded Mare (Class 1, Class 2, RID (GB), AID or Supplementary Grade Up Register) and be by a Class 1, Class 2 or RID (GB) stallion on the Irish Draught Breed Register.
- All yearling, two and three year old COLTS must be bitted and shown by an experienced handler of 18 years of age or over. All three year old colts must be un-inspected
- Stallions (In hand or ridden) must also be inspected and overstamped by the IDHS (GB) and be Class 1, 2 or RID (GB)
- RIDDEN Pure bred and Part Bred Irish Draughts must be registered with or overstamped by the IDHS (GB) and in the correct ownership.
- All ridden horses must be 153cm (15hh) or over. All riders of stallions must be 18 years of age or over and must display a red, white and blue ribbon in their tails.
- All owners of Pure Bred and Part Bred Irish Draught horses must be full members of the IDHS (GB).
- All Irish Draught Sport Horse Breeding and Youngstock In Hand and Ridden exhibits must have a minimum of 25% proven Irish Draught breeding and be registered on the Irish Draught Sport Horse Register.

The Irish Draught Owners and Breeders Group Youngstock Challenge and IDHS (GB) Irish Draught Part Bred Sport Horse Youngstock Challenge

This show is a qualifier for both The Irish Draught Owners & Breeders Group Youngstock Challenge and the IDHS (GB) Irish Draught Part Bred / Sport Horse Youngstock Challenge.

The two highest placed Irish Draught pure-breds and Irish Draught Sport Horses from each age group in Classes 208 - 210 will qualify.

If one or both have already qualified, the horse next in line in each age group will qualify for their respective final which will be held on the 6th and 7th September 2025 at Onley Equestrian Centre, Onley Grounds Farm, Willoughby, Rugby, Warwickshire CV23 8AJ. There will be three preliminary classes with the two highest placed semi finalists from each class going forward to the Championship where the Champion will receive £500 and the Reserve Champion £150.

Qualifiers will be contacted by a member of the IDHS Show Team.

IDHS(GB) £2,000 Ridden Challenge.

This show is a qualifier for the IDHS GB £2000 Ridden Challenge.

The highest placed horses (not already qualified) from Class 212 will qualify for the final of the IDHS (GB) £2,000 Ridden Challenge which will be held at the IDHS (GB) National Championship Show on 6th and 7th September 2025 at Onley Equestrian Centre, Onley Grounds Farm, Willoughby, Rugby, Warwickshire CV23 8AJ.

A horse may only qualify for the final once, regardless of the type or number of classes won, placed in or entered. Qualifiers will be contacted by a member of the IDHS Show Team.

In the Final, the Champion will be awarded £1,000 prize money the Reserve Champion will be awarded £500 and 3rd to 7th inclusive will be awarded £100 each. In addition, the highest placed Purebred Irish Draught will receive £100, and the highest placed Sport Horse will receive £50.

Tattersalls RoR OPEN In-Hand Show Series Qualifier 2026

Open to all RoR and NR **competition registered** horses, 3yrs and over, fillies, mares and geldings. Handlers must be 15 years or over on the 1st January 2025. Horses do not need to be shod to compete in the RoR Open In-Hand class. Horses can be shown in a bitless/In-Hand Bridle. Blemishes caused through racing will be ignored. All those entering horses and/or participating in the show agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force. Handlers/grooms must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap.

The first three go forward to the final at The Jockey Club RoR National Championships at Aintree, August 2026

Prizes – RoR rosettes 1^{st} – 4^{th} plus Tattersalls RoR official merchandise voucher 1^{st} £20, 2^{nd} £10, 3^{rd} £5,

Tattersalls RoR Open Ridden Show Series Qualifier 2026

Open to RoR competition registered horses, 4yrs and over, mares and geldings, Thoroughbred mare or gelding, 4years old or over, any height. Riders must be 15 years or over by January 1st 2025. Horses should be ridden in a snaffle, Pelham or simple double bridle with a plain cavesson noseband. Horses should be plaited.

The first THREE go forward to the championship at Hickstead in June 2026 All entries MUST be competition registered with the RoR and include their competition registration number on entry form and have RACED in GB. All those entering horses and/or participating in the show agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force'. Please be aware that the show will split the class on the horse's last run in a race (NH or Flat) or will provide 2 ride judges should the entries

exceed 20. Please mark your entry form accordingly. Competitors must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap. Racing injuries and blemishes will NOT be ignored in this series

Prizes – RoR rosettes 1^{st} – 4^{th} plus Tattersalls RoR official merchandise voucher 1^{st} £30, 2^{nd} £20, 3^{rd} £10, Highest placed Veteran (15+) £10.

For qualifiers held before July 31st, 2025, **the winner qualifies** for the Tattersalls RoR Open Ridden Special at the Jockey Club RoR National Championships in August 2025. The Highest Placed Veteran qualifies for the RoR Ridden Veteran Final on the same day.

Tattersalls RoR AMATEUR Ridden Show Series Qualifier 2026

Open to all RoR and NR competition registered horses, 4yrs and over, mares and geldings, owned, produced and ridden by an Amateur. Riders must be 15 years or over on the 1st January 2025. Horses should be ridden in a snaffle, Pelham or simple double bridle with a plain cavesson noseband. Horses should be plaited. Racing injuries and blemishes ARE IGNORED in this series. The Series is open to AMATEUR riders only – those employed in racing will be allowed to compete. Class will be judged under 'riding horse' format without 'type' being taken into consideration.

The Judge will not ride in the qualifiers but will ride in the Final.

Competitors/handlers/grooms must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap.

The first three go forward to the final at the Hickstead Derby Meeting June 2026.

Prizes – RoR rosettes 1^{st} – 4^{th} plus Tattersalls RoR official merchandise voucher 1^{st} £20, 2^{nd} £10, 3^{rd} £5, Highest placed Veteran (15+) £10.

For qualifiers held prior to July 31st, 2025, the winner will qualify for the Tattersalls RoR Amateur Ridden Show Series Special at the Jockey Club RoR National Championships on August 23rd 2025. Highest Placed Veteran qualifies for the RoR Ridden Veteran Final on the same day.

Amateur definition:

The rules are as in the rulebook with the following addition that an amateur may not show a horse owned or sponsored by a company or commercial firm. In addition, a person classed as an amateur must not be supported by a company in any way or act as brand ambassador whether financially or in-

kind. An amateur is a person who for the purpose of RoR classes does not/has not during the current season or previous season:

Engage (d) in breeding, livery, buying or selling, dealing or hiring horses in a commercial capacity. Horses must not have been stabled at or reside in a Professional Producer's/Trainer's yard from January 1st, 2024. Riders must not have ridden any animals produced by a Professional/Trainer in the current or previous season. Horses and riders must not receive any help from a Professional Producer/Trainer at a SHOW in the current season. A rider who has ridden for a Professional/Producer Trainer in the current or previous season must not have ridden horses at a show. Any breaches of this ruling will be taken seriously and will result in disqualification from future classes.

PALOMINO & CREAM DILUTE

This Show is affiliated to The British Palomino Society.

These classes open to members and NON members this section is a qualifier for the BPS National Championship, qualification cards to be awarded upon placings, non-members have 14 days to join the BPS in order to compete at the National Championships, only fully paid up BPS members can be awarded the colour awards with memberships cards present in the class.

PRIVATE DRIVING

This is a Victoria Extravaganza Carriage Driving Championship Qualifier. The Champion will qualify for the grand final to be held on Sunday 14th September 2025 at Bury Farm Equestrian Club, New Bury Farm, Mill Road, Slapton, Bucks, LU7 9BT. In the event that the Champion has already qualified, then the Reserve Champion to qualify. If the Reserve has also qualified, the rosette to be awarded back to the Champion. Once qualified, the horse, Whip and Vehicle may not be changed.

Exercise Vehicles – This is a qualifying class for the Victoria Extravaganza Carriage Driving Championship Qualifier

Open to horses & ponies, 4 years old or over. A single, pair or tandem driven to a carriage of non-traditional type design and includes those with pneumatic tyres specifically designed for carriages (i.e., not car tyres). Lamps

need not be carried. Judging will include general cleanliness, safety of turnout, correct fitting of harness and vehicle suitability.

Private Driving – This is a qualifying class for the Victoria Extravaganza Carriage Driving Championship Qualifier

Horses or ponies, 4 years old or over, singles or multiples, driven to a traditional or traditional type vehicle. A traditional vehicle means a vehicle of traditional profile and identifiable type to resemble the design of a carriage built prior to the First World War.

The vehicle may be made from modern materials but must have traditional style springing and carriage lamps. Pneumatic tyred vehicles, trade turnouts and show wagons are not eligible.

Lady or Gentleman Whip

Open to horses and ponies 4 years old and over, singles and multiples, any turnout. Open to both traditional and non-traditional vehicles and harness. The driving skill and ability of the whip will be judged irrespective of turnout.

LIHS BSHA RISING STAR QUALIFIERS

Open to members and pre-registered non-members, 15 yrs and over, eligible under Rising Star Amateur rules.

A results points table will run for all qualifying classes and a 'wild card' will be awarded to those unqualified with the highest points in each section following the final qualifier.

The Judge will NOT ride exhibits in these classes or at the Finals.

Open to members and non-members. All competitors and grooms must adhere to VHS Rules in all circumstances. Failure to do so may result in immediate disqualification.

Both the In-hand and Ridden Class to be run as one class but judged as separate age categories:

Diamond Veteran (25 years and over), Veteran (20–24 years) & Pre-Veteran (15–19 years). Open to horses and ponies of any breed and height.

VHS Regional Final qualification. All competitors placed 1st to 4th in each age category will qualify for the corresponding class at VHS Regional Finals. Members must carry their cards in the ring and have their showing card signed by the judge in the ring as proof of qualification. Non-members will receive a red qualification card which can be exchanged for signed showing card when applying for VHS membership. *This MUST be done within 21 days of qualification*. It is the competitors' responsibility to present their Showing card to the judge.

Those wishing to join or renew with the Society will need to apply for this before 1st May each year or a late penalty fee of £15 will be charged.

Regional Finals are open to members only.

All competitors are eligible to enter open classes at the National Veteran Championships, to be held at Arena UK, Lincolnshire on $29^{th} - 31^{st}$ August 2025. No qualification or membership necessary. See VHS website for schedule which is available mid-season 2025.

WORKING HUNTER RULES

- 1. Ponies must be 4 years old or over.
- 2. Correctly secured Skull Caps/Riding Hats Nos. PASO15 2011, VG1, (BS) EN1384 2023, ASTM F1163 2015 and 2023, SNELL E2016 and E2021 onwards, AS/NZS 3838 2006 onwards, MUST be worn by riders at all times when mounted. Hats should have a plain cover, either Black, Navy Blue, Brown, Grey or Green. It is considered to be the responsibility of the rider/parents/guardians to ensure the hat complies with current standards rider/parents/guardians are responsible for ensuring the manufacturer's guidelines with regard to fit and replacement are followed.
- 3. A rider whose hat comes off will be eliminated. A rider whose strap comes undone, whilst competing must on Penalty of Elimination replace it or fasten it before continuing. He may stop without penalty to fasten the strap.
- During a class riders must wear correct Head Gear in accordance with Rule 2 above and must wear a Riding Jacket, shirt and tie or stock, a pair of breeches or jodhpurs and a pair of Top Boots or jodhpur Boots. Gaiters may be worn. Chaps are not permitted. Waterproof Jackets are permitted. In extreme weather conditions a Judge may use his discretion regarding coats on the day. Earrings and Body studs MUST NOT be worn. Mobile telephones, smart watches and earpieces MUST not be taken into the ring, riders using these devices in the ring will be disqualified.
- 5. In all classes the rider must complete all phases including the In-Hand section.
- 6. Body Protectors MUST be worn when jumping including practice rings. All types of Air Jackets are not allowed except with medical dispensation.
- 7. Snaffles permitted. Bit-less bridles, running gags and fixed/solid metal curb chains and any form of blinker or amended bridles are not permitted.
- 8. No spurs to be worn.

- 9. Front Boots including Over-Reach Boots of a plain colour, may be used for Phase 1 of the WHP/WH Classes ONLY.
- 10. Whips are not to exceed 75cms (30ins). Hunting Crops are permissible. This includes whips/sticks used by leaders in lead rein classes. Padded whips are recommended for WHP classes. A whip, if carried, must be held in the hand by the handle with the handle at the top. At all times the whip must be used; For a good reason, as an aid to encourage the horse/pony forward. At an appropriate time, namely when the horse/pony is reluctant to go forward with the normal aids of seat and legs. In the right place, namely down the shoulder or behind the leg. Never over arm. With appropriate severity. No more than twice for any incident. Riders must not hit a horse/pony before the start of a jumping course.
- 11. In Lead Rein classes Reins must be of a normal length and not knotted together or stitched together at a shorter length. Handles on saddles are permitted but the reins must not be attached to the handle or to the saddle. When the pony is at rest or being worked in with or without a rider reins must not be fixed behind the cantle of the saddle.
- 12. Under no circumstances may tack be changed during the judging of a class.
- 13. In all classes, except Heritage Mountain & Moorland animals' manes must be plaited except animals with hogged manes.
- 14. Ponies competing in Heritage Mountain & Moorland classes must not be shown with any false hair.
- 15. Weighted tails are not permitted in plaited or Heritage Mountain & Moorland classes and will result in disqualification
- 16. Fall of either horse or rider in the ring in either phase-Disqualification (A complete turn-round constitutes a refusal)
- 17. Jumping must be taken first and any pony eliminated will not be required for final judging.

WORKING HUNTER CLASSES

(LIHS Classes 229 and 230 £25 entry fee)

230. **BSHA – Rising Star Working Hunter Type**

Open ONLY to Hunters, mare or gelding, 4 years old and over exceeding 148cm (14.2hh approx.) Any horse which is registered / previously registered as a Grade A showjumper, Advanced Eventer, or above as at 1st January of the current year, is not eligible. Rider to be 15yrs or over. Height of fences: minimum 3'0", maximum 3'3", maximum spread 3'3". Please note the height of the fences may be raised at the final at the discretion of the Course builder/ BSHA Representative.

A Rider may ride up to two Horses in the jumping phase only and then must select one Horse to take through to the Individual Show & Conformation stage. No change of Rider is allowed. (2025)

The highest placed unqualified horse in the top 5 will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Working Hunter Type Supreme Final at the LIHS in December 2025. QUALIFICATION WILL BE CONFIRMED BY EMAIL ONCE BSHA MEMBERSHIP IS COMPLETED WITHIN 14 DAYS OF QUALIFICATION

231. **BSHA – Rising Star Working Show Horse**

Open ONLY to Hacks, Cobs, Maxi Cobs and Riding Horses, mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 148cms. Any horse which is Grade B showjumper, Intermediate Eventer, or above as at 1st January of the current year, is not eligible. Rider to be 15yrs or over.

Height of fences: minimum 2'6", maximum 2'9", maximum spread 2'9".

Please note the height of the fences may be raised at the final at the discretion of the Course builder/ BSHA Representative.

A Rider may ride up to two Horses in the jumping phase only and then must select one Horse to take through to the Individual Show & Conformation stage. No change of Rider is allowed. (2025)

The highest placed unqualified horse in the top 5 will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Working Show Horse Supreme Final at the LIHS in December 2025. QUALIFICATION WILL BE CONFIRMED BY EMAIL ONCE BSHA MEMBERSHIP IS COMPLETED WITHIN 14 DAYS OF QUALIFICATION

Champion and Reserve Champion Rosettes

(Winners of class 230 and 231 to compete. Champion to go forward to the overall Working Hunter Supreme Champion)

232. Training Stakes – Lead Rein

Ponies 4 yrs. old and over, not exceeding 122cms. Suitable to be ridden by a rider not to have attained their 11th birthday before 1st January in the current year.

233. Training Stakes - 50cms

Horse or Pony 4yrs old and over. Rider must be the correct age for the height of the pony they ride. Maximum height of fences 50cms.

234. Training Stakes - 60cms

Horse or Pony 4yrs old and over. Rider must be the correct age for the height of the pony they ride. Maximum height of fences 60cms.

235. Training Stakes - 70cms

Horse or Pony 4yrs old and over. Rider must be the correct age for the height of the pony they ride. Maximum height of fences 70cms.

236. Training Stakes - 80cms

Horse or Pony 4yrs old and over. Rider must be the correct age for the height of the pony they ride. Maximum height of fences 80cms.

237. Training Stakes - 90cms

Horse or Pony 4yrs old and over. Rider must be the correct age for the height of the pony they ride. Maximum height of fences 90cms.

238. Open Heritage Working Hunter Pony. Riders any age.

- 241. **Open Working Hunter** Mare or Gelding, 4 years and over, exceeding 148cm. Height of fences not to exceed 90cm.
