**THE CARDIGAN COUNTY AGRICULTURE SHOW IS EXEMPT  
FROM PRE-MOVEMENT TESTING**

This exemption only applies when the animal returns to its original farm or is taken directly to slaughter.

We have been asked by WAG to let exhibitors know about the intended change in policy and to stress that:

- The exemption from Pre-Movement Testing remains for shows where the cattle are not housed and are present for less than 24 hours.
- Pre-Movement Testing is required where cattle are moved to shows that are held on multiple days and/or where cattle are housed.
- Any show where animals are sold or moved to premises other than the premises of origin or direct to slaughter, continue to require Pre-Movement Testing, as before.

And that:

- Bovine TB has significant potential to disrupt and cause long lasting financial consequences to your business, so prevention from infection should always be your priority.
- All cattle owners are recommended to undertake Pre-Movement Testing, and ideally also voluntarily post-movement testing of animals, to safeguard the health of the high value of stock attending shows.

IMPORTANT - THIS RULING MUST BE ADHERED TO**

The Committee confirms that it will undertake to comply with all rules and conditions and obtain the necessary licence to hold these sections in accordance with the Animal Health Act and Orders appertaining at the time of the show. Please make sure you are fully aware of conditions that will prevail on the show day. Please ensure that all livestock vehicles are clean. Unclean vehicles will be barred from entering the showground.

### EXHIBITOR'S INFORMATION

- (a) To comply with Health and Safety Executive guidelines the Society has created animal walks. It is a condition of entry that all exhibits keep within these designated routes, that all reasonable precautions are taken to prevent accidents, and that guidance is taken from Officials or Stewards at crossing points, etc.
- (b) Anyone on a horse or pony **MUST WEAR A HARD HAT ACCORDING TO CURRENT EUROPEAN OR B.S.I. STANDARD WITH THE CHIN STRAP FASTENED SECURELY** with the exception of Riders in BSPS classes who are required to adhere to rule 43 in the 2024 BSPS rulebook with regard to hat specification and tagging.

Fractious animals are not allowed to be exhibited.

All exhibitors should ensure that they have adequate insurance cover, as the Society will not in any case, or under any circumstances, hold itself responsible for any loss, damage, mis delivery, illness or accident that may occur through, or to, any exhibit, or trade stand or person from any cause whatsoever, and it shall hold the Society harmless, and indemnify it against legal proceedings arising from any of the above-named circumstances.

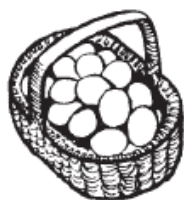

  2. All entries to be in the hands of the Secretary by Friday, 25<sup>th</sup> July 2025
- NO LATE ENTRIES ACCEPTED.**
3. Entry fees to be paid in advance.
  4. Any Livestock Exhibitor who does not have a Livestock pass will be required to pay the admittance fee.
  5. All exhibits to be on the field by 9.00 a.m.
  6. Should any dispute arise in any circumstances, the complainant to lodge £10.00 in the hands of the Secretary, which sum will be forfeited if the objection is not upheld by the Committee, whose decision shall be final.
  7. In Classes where measurements are stipulated, half an inch will be allowed in height for shoeing.
  8. The person in charge of stock must see that they are properly placed and secured in the place allocated to them, and those in charge of stock are particularly requested not to leave at any time during the Show the stock which they have in their charge. The Society, its officers and servant will not be responsible for any error or mistakes that may be made in placing, penning or securing the stock.
  9. All exhibits in Horticultural Section must have been grown by exhibitor.
  10. Only Officials will be allowed in the Horticultural Section during judging.
  11. Competitors in Riding Classes to be properly attired.
  12. The Society has the right to cancel their Show at short notice in the event of adverse weather.
  13. The Society will not in any case, or under any circumstances hold itself responsible for any loss, damage, mis-delivery, illness or accident, that may occur through or to any exhibit, trade stand or person from any cause whatsoever, and it shall hold the Society harmless, and indemnify it against any legal proceedings arising from any of the above-named circumstances.
  14. All dogs must be on a short lead on show ground.
  15. All trophies to be returned to the Secretary by 1st July, 2025.
  16. The Society has the right to amalgamate any Class in any section, if less than two exhibitors entered.

17. Stallions, colts and bulls not to be ridden or led by juniors who have not attained their 14<sup>th</sup> birthday before 1st January in the current year.
18. All exhibitors should ensure that they have Public Liability insurance for an adequate indemnity to protect against their liability to include their helpers and handlers.
19. Fractious animals are not allowed to be exhibited.
20. Correctly secured Skull Caps/Riding Hats Nos. PAS015 2011, VG1, (BS) EN1384 2023, ASTM F1163 2015 and 2023, SNELL E2016 and E2021 onwards, AS/NZS 3838 2006 onwards, MUST be worn by riders at all times when mounted. It is considered to be the responsibility of the rider/parents/guardians to ensure the hat complies with current standards rider/parents/guardians are responsible for ensuring the manufacturer's guidelines with regard to fit and replacement are followed.
21. Pigs must be handled with a board and stick.
22. All Boars must be shown by two handlers.

# HORSE SECTION RULES & REGULATIONS

## **NPS Mountain and Moorland**

Affiliation Number: S28.005

These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. Ponies must be registered in the main body of their respective Mountain & Moorland Stud Books. Part bred's are not eligible. Qualifying rounds for most NPS competitions are open to ponies owned by NPS members and non-members but only ponies owned by adult NPS Qualifying or Life members are eligible to qualify for the final of the competition at the NPS Summer Championship Show at the Three Counties Showground, Malvern in August 2027.

The highest placed pony owned by an NPS member in each class will qualify for the final. Where this pony has already qualified, the pony standing next in line which is owned by an NPS member, and has not already qualified, receives the qualification. Qualification may go to no lower than 3rd place. Judges and /or stewards are requested to check membership cards prior to presenting the qualifying rosettes.

NPS/WTJ Insurance Brokers Ltd Home Produced Ridden Championship – Riders of Home Produced ponies (see definition in the NPS Rule Book) can wear a white arm band in classes where this is indicated. These ponies, if owned by NPS members, are then eligible to qualify for the final at the NPS Summer Championship Show. Cups will be presented to Prize Winners

## **Traditional Gypsy Cob Association**

Affiliation No: 26/0108/STQ

**No known breeding required to enter these classes.**

**No Membership required to Enter these Classes.**

TGCA Breed classes are qualifiers for the Best of Breed Finals at the Traditional Gypsy Cob Association's (TGCA) National Breed Championship Show "TOYS".

Traditional Classes are open to all traditional gypsy cobs and are qualifiers for the Traditional Finals at 'TOYS'.

**Stallions** – All stallions (four years and over) in order to enter any TGCA affiliated class **MUST** be TGCA registered, have passed TGCA stallion evaluations and their TGCA stallion disc displayed on their bridle. Stallions and colts over the age of two, **MUST** be shown in a stallion bridle with a metal bit and chain lead as per the current TGCA rulebook.

Current TGCA members must present their Membership card and Qualification card to the judge in the ring for signature.

Non-members **MUST** receive a qualification card from the judge and have 21 days to join the TGCA and register their horse to validate the qualification. Please refer to [www.tgca.co.uk](http://www.tgca.co.uk) for further details including membership, horse registration and showing rules (contained within the members handbook).

### **The Greatest Gelding Award**

The award is aimed to encourage the showing of geldings, therefore creating a market for often unwanted colt foals and enabling the creation of a network of potential performance prospects to represent the best Traditional Gypsy Cob breed in the World at the highest level.

This Award should be given to the highest placed registered Traditional Gelding.

**PLEASE NOTE THIS SHOW IS A 2027 QUALIFIER.**

### **Quest for a Star Championship Inc Youngstock Quest for a Star- Traditional Gypsy Cobs**

1st, 2nd and 3rd from the TGCA classes above may go forward to the Quest for a Star Championship as per below rule.

**ONLY current TGCA members and horse/pony that is already TGCA registered can exhibit in this championship, if exhibit already has their Quest for a Star Qualification in particular section, they should be ask stand aside to allow members that have not yet qualified.**

Membership card and Member's qualification card (specific to that exhibit) **must** be presented upon **entry into the ring**. The Champion and Reserve qualify for the Ultimate Star Championships at TOYS.

### **Quest Championship for your mini Cobs**

1st, 2nd and 3rd from the TGCA classes above may go forward to the Quest for a Star Championship for Mini Cobs (13 hands and

under) as per below rule.

ONLY current TGCA members and horse/pony that is already TGCA registered can exhibit in this championship.

Membership card and Members qualification card (specific to that exhibit) must be presented upon entry into the ring. The

Champion/Reserve qualify for the Quest Ultimate Star Mini Championships

### **The Greatest Gelding Award - Traditional Gypsy Cobs**

The award is aimed to encourage the showing of geldings, therefore creating a market for often unwanted colt foals and enabling the creation of a network of potential performance prospects to represent the best Traditional Gypsy Cob breed in the World at the highest level.

**This Award should be given to the highest placed registered Traditional Gelding.** The judge will award this within the classes/championship.

## **Shetland Ponies**

1. Classes must be confined to SPS-BS registered ponies. Ponies **must be named on the entry form** and in the catalogue if one is produced. Society rosettes must only be given to ponies registered with the Society or to foals eligible for registration.
2. Three-year-old fillies with foals at foot may not be shown. All foals must be a minimum of three weeks old on the day of the Show.
3. IN ORDER TO ENTER A STALLION CLASS AT AN AFFILIATED SHOW, ENTIRE MALES AGED 4 YEARS OLD AND OVER MUST HAVE AN "S" NUMBER AND HAVE BEEN SUCCESSFULLY THROUGH EITHER THE SPS-BS STALLION ASSESSMENT PRIOR TO 2006 OR THE CURRENT SPSBS VOLUNTARY VETERINARY EXAMINATION. Ridden stallions MUST display a stallion bridle badge. In-hand entire males 2 years and over are advised to display a stallion bridle badge.
4. There must be no colts or entire males in Young Handlers classes. Children under 14 years old may not show colts (excluding foals) or entire males in In-hand classes. Children under 12 years old on the day of the show may not show entire males in ridden classes. In the interests of safety, hard hats must be worn by all handlers aged 14 years or under in In hand classes. Exhibitors should not kneel but remain standing while in the ring. Hard hats must be worn by all exhibitors,

irrespective of age, in ridden classes. Ridden and driven ponies must be 4 years old or over.

In ridden Classes, if a rider falls off at any time whilst in the ring, both pony and rider must leave the ring, rider dismounted, and take no further part.

## **CHAPS**

This Show is affiliated to The Coloured Horse & Pony Society (UK). Affiliation No. 26-038

Both owner and the rider/exhibitor need NOT be a member of CHAPS (UK) nor must the horse or pony be registered with CHAPS (UK) to compete. However in order to qualify both owner and rider/exhibitor need to be a current showing member and have a valid qualifier card. Members should apply to CHAPS (UK) for appropriate qualifier card. The CHAPS (UK) Championship Show will be held on 20<sup>th</sup> – 22<sup>nd</sup> August 2026.

The following classes are CHAPS (UK) Qualifiers 154 – 157.

For full rulings and information on competition/qualification, please refer to the CHAPS (UK) Members' Handbook; or visit [www.chapsuk.com](http://www.chapsuk.com). Only Skewbalds/Piebalds may compete in these classes. (as defined in the current CHAPS UK Members' Handbook) may compete in these classes. All stallions, 4 yrs old and over entering these classes must be graded with CHAPS (UK). All stallions must wear Stallion ID discs in the ring without exception.

## **IRISH DRAUGHT HORSE SOCIETY (GB)**

**This show is affiliated to the IDHS(GB) and therefore horses competing in Classes 206 - 212 should be eligible under the below criteria:-**

- All Pure Bred Breeding and Youngstock In-hand exhibits must be the progeny of a Graded Mare (Class 1, Class 2, RID (GB), AID or Supplementary Grade Up Register) and be by a Class 1, Class 2 or RID (GB) stallion on the Irish Draught Breed Register.
- All yearling, two and three year old COLTS must be bitted and shown by an experienced handler of 18 years of age or over. All three year old colts must be un-inspected
- Stallions (In hand or ridden) must also be inspected and over stamped by the IDHS (GB) and be Class 1, 2 or RID (GB)
- RIDDEN Pure bred and Part Bred Irish Draughts must be registered with or over stamped by the IDHS (GB) and in the correct ownership.

- All ridden horses must be 153cm (15hh) or over. All riders of stallions must be 18 years of age or over and must display a red, white and blue ribbon in their tails.
- All owners of Pure Bred and Part Bred Irish Draught horses must be full members of the IDHS (GB).
- All Irish Draught Sport Horse Breeding and Youngstock In Hand and Ridden exhibits must have a minimum of 25% proven Irish Draught breeding and be registered on the Irish Draught Sport Horse Register.

### **The Irish Draught Owners and Breeders Group Youngstock Challenge**

This show is a qualifier for The Irish Draught Owners & Breeders Group Youngstock Challenge.

The two highest placed Irish Draught pure-breds from each age group in Classes 208-210 will qualify.

If one or both have already qualified, the horse next in line in each age group will qualify for their respective final which will be held at the IDHS (GB) National Championship Show on 5th & 6th September 2026 at Pickering Grange Equestrian, Pickering Grange Farm, Ellistown, Terrance Road, Coalville, LE67 1EZ. There will be three preliminary classes with the two highest placed semi-finalists from each class going forward to the Championship where the Champion will receive £500 and the Reserve Champion £150.

Qualifiers will be contacted by a member of the IDHS Show Team.

### **IDHS(GB) £2,000 Ridden Challenge.**

This show is a qualifier for the IDHS GB £2000 Ridden Challenge.

The highest placed horses (not already qualified) from Class 212 will qualify for the final of the IDHS (GB) £2,000 Ridden Challenge which will be held at the IDHS (GB) National Championship Show on 5th & 6th September 2026 at Pickering Grange Equestrian, Pickering Grange Farm, Ellistown, Terrance Road, Coalville, LE67 1EZ.

A horse may only qualify for the final once, regardless of the type or number of classes won, placed in or entered. Qualifiers will be contacted by a member of the IDHS Show Team.

In the Final, the Champion will be awarded £1,000 prize money the Reserve Champion will be awarded £500 and 3<sup>rd</sup> to 7<sup>th</sup> inclusive will be awarded £100

each. In addition, the highest placed Purebred Irish Draught will receive £100, and the highest placed Sport Horse will receive £50.

## **RETRAINING OF RACEHORSES (RoR)**

### **Tattersalls RoR OPEN In-Hand Show Series Qualifier 2026**

All those entering horses and/or participating in the show agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force. Handlers/grooms must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap.

### **Tattersalls RoR Open Ridden Show Series Qualifier 2026**

Open to RoR competition registered horses, 4yrs and over, mares and geldings, Thoroughbred mare or gelding, 4years old or over, any height. Riders must be 15 years or over by January 1<sup>st</sup> 2025. Horses should be ridden in a snaffle, Pelham or simple double bridle with a plain cavesson noseband. Horses should be plaited.

**The first THREE go forward to the championship at Hickstead in June 2026**

All entries **MUST** be competition registered with the RoR and include their competition registration number on entry form and have **RACED in GB**. All those entering horses and/or participating in the show agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force'. Please be aware that the show will split the class on the horse's last run in a race (NH or Flat) or will provide 2 ride judges should the entries exceed 20. Please mark your entry form accordingly. **Competitors must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap. Racing injuries and blemishes will NOT be ignored in this series**

**Prizes** – RoR rosettes 1<sup>st</sup> –4<sup>th</sup> plus Tattersalls RoR official merchandise voucher 1<sup>st</sup> £30, 2<sup>nd</sup> £20, 3<sup>rd</sup> £10, Highest placed Veteran (15+) £10.

*For qualifiers held before July 31<sup>st</sup>, 2025, the winner qualifies for the Tattersalls RoR Open Ridden Special at the Jockey Club RoR National Championships in August 2025. The Highest Placed Veteran qualifies for the RoR Ridden Veteran Final on the same day.*

### **Tattersalls RoR AMATEUR Ridden Show Series Qualifier 2026**

Open to all RoR and NR competition registered horses, 4yrs and over, mares and geldings, owned, produced and ridden by an Amateur. Riders must be 15 years or over on the 1<sup>st</sup> January 2025. Horses should be ridden in a snaffle, Pelham or simple double bridle with a plain cavesson noseband. Horses should be plaited. Racing injuries and blemishes ARE IGNORED in this series. The Series is open to AMATEUR riders only – those employed in racing will be allowed to compete. Class will be judged under ‘riding horse’ format without ‘type’ being taken into consideration.

The Judge will not ride in the qualifiers but will ride in the Final.

Competitors/handlers/grooms must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap.

### **The first three go forward to the final at the Hickstead Derby Meeting June 2026.**

**Prizes** – RoR rosettes 1<sup>st</sup> –4<sup>th</sup> plus Tattersalls RoR official merchandise voucher 1<sup>st</sup> £20, 2<sup>nd</sup> £10, 3<sup>rd</sup> £5, Highest placed Veteran (15+) £10.

*For qualifiers held prior to July 31<sup>st</sup>, 2025, the winner will qualify for the Tattersalls RoR Amateur Ridden Show Series Special at the Jockey Club RoR National Championships on August 23<sup>rd</sup> 2025. Highest Placed Veteran qualifies for the RoR Ridden Veteran Final on the same day.*

### **Amateur definition:**

The rules are as in the rulebook with the following addition that an amateur may not show a horse owned or sponsored by a company or commercial firm. In addition, a person classed as an amateur must not be supported by a company in any way or act as brand ambassador whether financially or in-kind. An amateur is a person who for the purpose of RoR classes does not/has not during the current season or previous season:

Engage (d) in breeding, livery, buying or selling, dealing or hiring horses in a commercial capacity. Horses must not have been stabled at or reside in a Professional Producer's/Trainer's yard from January 1st, 2024. Riders must

not have ridden any animals produced by a Professional/Trainer in the current or previous season. Horses and riders must not receive any help from a Professional Producer/Trainer at a SHOW in the current season. A rider who has ridden for a Professional/Producer Trainer in the current or previous season must not have ridden horses at a show. Any breaches of this ruling will be taken seriously and will result in disqualification from future classes.

## **PALOMINO & CREAM DILUTE**

This Show is affiliated to The British Palomino Society.

These classes open to members and NON members this section is a qualifier for the BPS National Championship, qualification cards to be awarded upon placings, non-members have 14 days to join the BPS in order to compete at the National Championships, only fully paid up BPS members can be awarded the colour awards with memberships cards present in the class.

## **PRIVATE DRIVING**

This is a Victoria Extravaganza Carriage Driving Championship Qualifier. The Champion will qualify for the grand final to be held on Sunday 13<sup>th</sup> September 2026 at Bury Farm Equestrian Club, New Bury Farm, Mill Road, Slapton, Bucks, LU7 9BT. In the event that the Champion has already qualified, then the Reserve Champion to qualify. If the Reserve has also qualified, the rosette to be awarded back to the Champion. Once qualified, the horse, Whip and Vehicle may not be changed.

**Exercise Vehicles – This is a qualifying class for the Victoria Extravaganza Carriage Driving Championship Qualifier**

Open to horses & ponies, 4 years old or over. A single, pair or tandem driven to a carriage of non-traditional type design and includes those with pneumatic tyres specifically designed for carriages (i.e., not car tyres). The vehicle may be made from modern materials but must have traditional style springing and carriage lamps. Pneumatic tyred vehicles, trade turnouts and show wagons are not eligible.

### **Lady or Gentleman Whip**

Open to horses and ponies 4 years old and over, singles and multiples, any turnout. Open to both traditional and non-traditional vehicles and harness. The driving skill and ability of the whip will be judged irrespective of turnout.

Any competitors/ horses which have existing BSHA membership/ registration for 2026 will not be required to complete any LIHS Membership / Registration for these classes.

# WORKING HUNTERS SECTION

## WORKING HUNTER RULES

1. Ponies must be 4 years old or over.
2. Correctly secured Skull Caps/Riding Hats Nos. PAS015 2011, VG1, (BS) EN1384 2023, ASTM F1163 2015 and 2023, SNELL E2016 and E2021 onwards, MUST be worn by riders at all times when mounted. Hats should have a plain cover, either Black, Navy Blue, Brown, Grey or Green. It is considered to be the responsibility of the rider/parents/guardians to ensure the hat complies with current standards rider/parents/guardians are responsible for ensuring the manufacturer's guidelines with regard to fit and replacement are followed.
3. A rider whose hat comes off will be eliminated. A rider whose strap comes undone, whilst competing must on Penalty of Elimination replace it or fasten it before continuing. He may stop without penalty to fasten the strap.
4. During a class riders must wear correct Head Gear in accordance with Rule 2 above and must wear a Riding Jacket, shirt and tie or stock, a pair of breeches or jodhpurs and a pair of Top Boots or jodhpur Boots. Gaiters may be worn. Chaps are not permitted. Waterproof Jackets are permitted. In extreme weather conditions a Judge may use his discretion regarding coats on the day. Earrings and Body studs MUST NOT be worn. Mobile telephones, smart watches and earpieces MUST not be taken into the ring, riders using these devices in the ring will be disqualified.
5. In all classes the rider must complete all phases including the In-Hand section.
6. Body Protectors MUST be worn when jumping including practice rings. All types of Air Jackets are not allowed except with medical dispensation.
7. Snaffles permitted. Bit-less bridles, running gags and fixed/solid metal curb chains and any form of blinker or amended bridles are not permitted.
8. No spurs to be worn.

9. Front Boots including Over-Reach Boots of a plain colour, may be used for Phase 1 of the WHP/WH Classes ONLY.
10. Whips are not to exceed 75cms (30ins). Hunting Crops are permissible. This includes whips/sticks used by leaders in lead rein classes. Padded whips are recommended for WHP classes. A whip, if carried, must be held in the hand by the handle with the handle at the top. At all times the whip must be used; For a good reason, as an aid to encourage the horse/pony forward. At an appropriate time, namely when the horse/pony is reluctant to go forward with the normal aids of seat and legs. In the right place, namely down the shoulder or behind the leg. Never over arm. With appropriate severity. No more than twice for any incident. Riders must not hit a horse/pony before the start of a jumping course. Baton whips only in BSPS Classes.
11. In Lead Rein classes Reins must be of a normal length and not knotted together or stitched together at a shorter length. Handles on saddles are permitted but the reins must not be attached to the handle or to the saddle. When the pony is at rest or being worked in with or without a rider reins must not be fixed behind the cantle of the saddle.
12. Under no circumstances may tack be changed during the judging of a class.
13. In all classes, except Heritage Mountain & Moorland animals' manes must be plaited except animals with hogged manes.
14. Ponies competing in Heritage Mountain & Moorland classes must not be shown with any false hair.
15. Weighted tails are not permitted in plaited or Heritage Mountain & Moorland classes and will result in disqualification
16. Fall of either horse or rider in the ring in either phase-Disqualification (A complete turn-round constitutes a refusal)
17. Jumping must be taken first and any pony eliminated will not be required for final judging.

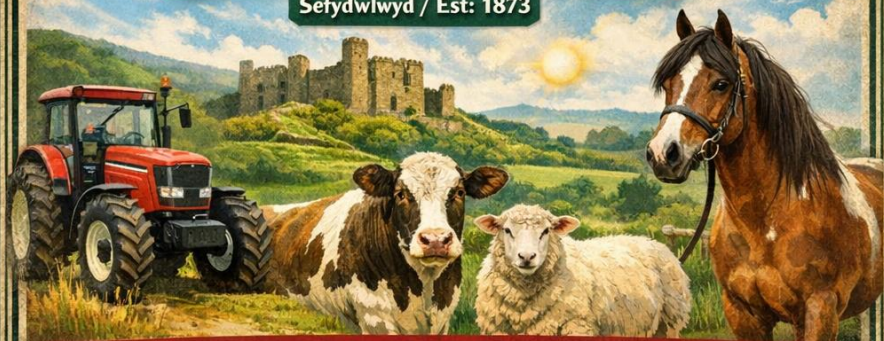

## **SAFETY POLICY STATEMENT**

### **DATGANIAD POLISI DIOGELWCH**

The Society's general policy is as follows :

To conduct the Society's undertaking in such a way as to ensure so far as is reasonably practicable, that persons who may be affected by its activities are not exposed to risks to their health, safety and welfare.

To bring to the notice of all stakeholder (show officials, exhibitors, retailers, caterers, their agents and employees) their duty to co-operate with the Society's health and safety management processes, to ensure that this policy is adequate/effective and to offer all necessary assistance to support health and safety management required by all participating stakeholders involved in the Show.

It is incumbent upon those participating in or attending the show before, during and after the show to eliminate unsafe behaviours and unsafe conditions to prevent accidents and assist/co-operate with the Society in their aims by proactively managing health and safety and abiding by the instructions given by Officials and Stewards of the Show. To achieve these aims, appropriate risk assessments must be carried out for the individual exhibitors and the Society's activities.

The Society will ensure that good environmental management principles are applied and will endeavour to ensure that its activities do not impact the environment.

#### **RESPONSIBILITIES FOR HEALTH AND SAFETY**

The society has overall responsibility for all aspects of Health, Safety and welfare and shall place emphasis on all participating stakeholders to be familiar with the society's health and safety arrangements, identified regulations, codes of practice and relevant guidance for ensuring the application of said requirements and ensuring safe working conditions during the all activities on the Society's premises (including preparation and 'clean up'/departure.

#### **SAFETY ADVISORY COMMITTEE**

Safety Committee will comprise of:

- Dyfrig Griffiths – Chairman
- Eleri James & Angharad Davies – Secretaries
- Barry Davies – Health and Safety Consultant

The Safety Advisory Committee shall be responsible for :

- a) Providing guidance and advice on Health, Safety and Welfare matters.
- b) Liaising with all statutory and external authorities and other appropriate organisations.
- c) Investigating and recording all accidents.
- d) Briefing and training all officials and stewards on the emergency procedure prior to the show day.

The Safety Advisory Committee and Emergency Response Team will co-ordinate Health and Safety and take charge of emergency and major incidents in the showground.

### **ORGANISERS, TRADE STAND PERSONNEL, CONTRACTORS**

Organisers, trade stand personnel, contractors and their respective employees as well as estate owners and their agents are responsible for managing the health and safety performance during their activities and in particular, ensuring that:

- a) Everything reasonably practicable is done to eliminate Health and Safety risks and to ensure proactive management of health, safety and welfare of those attending the show.
- b) They conduct themselves so that they do not put themselves or anyone else at risk.
- c) Access to and egress from the site is safe and unobstructed.
- d) Organisers, trade stand personnel and contractors abide with the Society's processes.

Members of the public and competitors are equally responsible for ensuring that they do not put other persons at risk and that they co-operate with the organisers in compliance with health and safety legislation.

### **EMERGENCY PROCEDURE**

- Eleri James & Angharad Williams – Secretaries
- Morris Davies – Committee Member
- Barry Davies – Health and Safety Consultant

Emergency Response Process has been devised and will be made available to all personnel (displayed within the Chairman's Stand) and visitors (displayed at Show public entrance).

These instructions should be adhered to in the event of a major incident occurring on the showground during the Show period:

- a) The Safety officer should be contacted immediately by the public address or radio.
- b) The major incident control point will be the Secretary's Office. Secondary point will be at the Trade Stand Enquiries Stand.
- c) First Aid Marquee will be located on the show plan. In need, contact should be made with First Aid personnel at the First Aid Marquee.
- d) Traffic and Gate Stewards will assist emergency vehicles to the scene of the incident. All the necessary vehicles will be directed to the car parks via the Livestock, Trade Stand and Exhibitors entrance.
- e) Medical Centre has been identified as the First Aid Marquee.
- f) Should total evacuation of the showground be required, the Emergency

Response Team will enlist the help of stewards to ensure that this is done in an orderly fashion via the main exit.

### **ACCIDENT/INCIDENT REPORTING AND INVESTIGATION**

Any accident or incident must be reported to the Show Safety Officer immediately. The Safety Officer will investigate all incidents and report findings to the show organisation immediately. All accidents will be recorded in the society's accident book. Significant accidents/incidents, as listed within the Reporting of Injuries, Diseases and Dangerous Occurrences Regulations 2013 (RIDDOR) will be reported to the HSE using the web-based report.

### **HEALTH AND SAFETY ARRANGEMENTS**

- a) Electricity – The position and routes of overhead and underground electrical cables must be identified and communicated to Show personnel. Temporary electrical cables and distribution systems must be agreed. Evidence of recent examination and test certificates for all electrical installations and apparatus will be obtained for showground installations and from individual exhibitors. Earthing and earth leakage protection will be provided and assurance provided to show personnel.
- b) Generators must be positioned well clear of structures and flammable materials. Visual inspection will be conducted by the Safety Officer.
- c) Liquid Petroleum Gas (LPG). Trade stand personnel and Caterers with LPG appliances must have these examined and tested by a competent person.
- d) Work Equipment - Work equipment must only be used by competent people.  
Loaned equipment must be fully maintained and serviceable. Plant and machinery must only be operated after adequate safety precautions have been implemented. Two ropes and chains should be adequate strength and attached to the towing tractor below the axle for all towing activities.
- e) Animals – Routes used by animals/livestock, public and vehicles will, as far as possible, be kept separate. Animals/livestock are not allowed into the Trade Stand and catering areas. Dogs should be kept on leads at all times and children must be supervised by an adult.
- f) Fire Precautions – Trade stand owners are responsible for managing fire risk within their respective areas. Health and Safety Consultant will conduct visual inspection prior to event commencing. Adequate emergency fire-fighting equipment and appliances must be provided by exhibitors and trade stand owners.
- g) Safety information. Warning notices and signs are prominently displayed. First Aid sites are clearly marked.
- h) Toilets and Washing Facilities. Adequate provision has been made for the expected number of visitors. Running water is provided at the Show ground.

i) Food Hygiene. Caterers are responsible for complying with the Local environmental Health department Legislation/Food Safety Act and must have Food Hygiene Certificate for all persons handling and preparing food.

j) Licencing for alcoholic Refreshments. Licences are held for alcohol sale. If any person attending the Show fails to comply with the reasonable requirements relating to Health, Safety and Welfare at the Show, then the Society will have the right to eject that person from the Show. If Society officials fail to take adequate action where a breach comes to their notice, then they could perhaps find themselves, albeit unwittingly, in the position of condoning a breach of the regulations. All persons attending the Show, whether they be officials, competitors or members of the public,
