Rheolau / Rules

1. All entries must have been made on the entry forms/sheet of paper and are to be in the hands of the Secretary no later than 10.15am on morning of Show.
2. Staging of exhibits must be completed by 10.30am when judging will commence. Every effort will be made to open the tent to the public at 12.30pm if judging has been completed
3. All exhibits must be competitors' own work and no article should have been worn, laundered, bought or previously won a prize in the Cardigan Show. All exhibits in the Farm Produce and Vegetables Sections must be grown by the exhibitor.
4. Whilst every precaution will be taken to safeguard the exhibits, the Committee will not be held responsible for loss or damage.
5. Presentation of trophies, followed by the Raffle Draw, will take place in the Horticultural Tent at 3.30pm prompt.
6. Allocation of prize money on production of prize-winning cards at 3.45pm.
7. All goods must be collected between 4.00pm and 4.30pm as Stewards will NOT be on duty after this time.
8. The Judges' decision is final and they are empowered to withhold prizes when exhibits are considered unworthy.
9. Highest number of points : 1st–3 points, 2nd–2 points, 3rd–1 point. If two or more exhibitors have the same points score, the number of firsts will be used to decide the issue. In the event of a joint placing, each competitor will be allocated the full points.
10. Prizes in all classes: 1st–£5, 2nd–£3, 3rd–£2. Children's section only (in classes with more than 10 entrants): 4th–£1
11. Entries accepted in the Farm Produce, Vegetables, Fruit and Flowers Section on the morning of the show, up till 10.00am, EXCEPT FLORAL ART when the closing date for FLORAL ART is Tuesday, 30th July, 2024.
12. The Society will not in any case, or under any circumstances hold itself responsible for any loss, damage, misdelivery, illness or accident, that may occur through or to any exhibit, trade stand or person from any cause whatsoever, and it shall hold the Society harmless and indemnify it against any legal proceedings arising from any of the above named circumstances.
13. The marquee will be open on Friday night from 2.00pm to 9.00pm for competitors who wish to stage their exhibits.

Statement for Show Schedules

An exhibit is composed of natural plant material, with or without accessories, contained within a space as specified in a show schedule.

NAFAS Rules state that disqualification will take place for the following reasons:

- ★ Failure to comply with any specific requirements of a class as stated in a show schedule, e.g. the measurements or the components.

- ★ Inclusion of fresh material that does not have roots or the cut ends of stems in water or water-retaining material.

Exceptions: Air plants, cactii, fruits, grass turf, lichen, moss, succulents, vegetables and long-lasting plant material (including strong fibrous stems)

WHICH WILL REMAIN TURGID FOR THE DURATION OF THE SHOW.

(Definition of 'turgid' : the state of firmness of plant tissue resulting from adequate moisture, causing the plant cells to be fully expanded).

- ★ Inclusion of artificial plant material (unless specifically allowed by a show schedule).

An exhibit is composed of natural plant material with or without accessories. Natural plant material is any vegetable matter. It includes fresh, dried, garden, wild or made up plant material flowers, foliage, fruit, vegetables and seaweed. All may be additionally coloured.

A Perpetual Cup [No. 54] is given in memory of Gill Hobby; also £15 will be kindly given by Mrs Celia Evans to the competitor with the highest number of points in the Floral Art Show.

Certificate of Merit for the best exhibit in the Floral Art Section.

The Pam McGrath Memorial Perpetual Salver is given by Cardigan Flower Arranging Club for the best exhibit in The Novice Section Class 190.

N.B.—There is NO ENTRY FEE charged for any exhibits.
